For the competitive individual with an insatiable desire to "give her the gun," hillclimbing events, autocross and road racing events are held on CLOSED courses under strict supervision. Competitive events of this kind are potentially more dangerous to the competitors because of the speed element, but the hazards to the motoring public are nil.

And what is a sports car? Generally, enthusiasts agree that it is a car designed and built for competition and general road use. It has a body design, weight distribution, suspension system, and an engine potential which as a whole make up a car of excellent roadability and handling characteristics. It is designed to stick to the road like glue and corner like a snake. The primary goal of the builder is to manufacture a car of high performance - and high performance means safety as well as speed. Eye wash, ala tail fins and chrome doo-dads, don't rate in this league. (Confidentially, comfort takes a little beating, too). Sports cars are safe cars. In our personal opinion, the car in the picture does not meet these requirements, and is not a true sports car.

To sum up the case, we believe that sports car clubs and events do everything possible to make their events safe and sane. The cars are properly engineered for safe driving, and the stressing of careful driving is a neverending crusade of club officials. Yes, we'll admit that there are a few leadfooted participants, but as a group the average of careful drivers is extremely high.

It is, in our opinion, still a matter of individual drivers, and we object to the inference that labels any particular group as careless."

The following article appeared in Vern Davis' column "Spark Plug" in the Altamont Enterprise on Dec. 6,1957:

"A photograph and caption which appeared in last week' news incites us to devote this week's column to certain as pects of the story, which offends the sensitivities of tru sports car enthusiasts.

The picture in question showed the unfortunate victim of an accident lying under his burning car, and the captio represented the vehicle as a "sports car." The purpose of publishing the story was, we assume, to impress readers of the folly of reckless driving. We feel, however, that the caption did a grave injustice to the sports car clubs and their activities, and for this reason we present the case for the defense.

Every activity of these clubs is conducted with a definite and positive emphasis on safe driving. At the recent 3-day Appalachian ralle sponsored by the Sports Car Club of America, an entire page of the instruction sheet t drivers carried the admonishing words - "SPORTSMANSHIP DEMANDS SAFE DRIVING." The theme of safe driving will be found in club papers and all sports car publications. We have never attended an event in which the rallyemaster has not devoted some time to discussing safe and courteous driving.

In planning the routes of sports car rallyes, every effort is made to avoid as much as possible busy main roads where the presence of a group of cars at an intersection would cause dangerous hazards. We recall that last year's Punkintown Fair Rallye was not run through Albany, Troy and Rensselaer, as requested by the Fair committee, because of objections from the rallyemaster who cited the dangerous traffic hazards involved.

Another compelling reason for safe, cautious driving in rallye and gymkhana events is the presence of the less competitive female - the "Mrs." These events are family events and the inclination to show off and step on the gas is subject to the deterring effect of wives who seem to ride with one eye glued on the speedometer.

Events in which the elapsed travel time is a factor are planned at average speeds well below legal speed limit In fact, we have participated in no event requiring an average speed of more than 36 miles per hour. Consequent the tempo of a rallye is one of a nice, leisurely Sunday




