



DE QUEL CÔTÉ EST L'ÉCOLE?

Part II

This is why you see cars towed to and from the course rather than being driven. Particularly in the case of novices, I would recommend that the car be prepared at the course the night before or towed in already prepared. In the confusion and excitement attendant at a race, it is all too easy to forget something. I went out and ran several laps at reduced speed with a wheel on which the studs were only finger tight. Fortunately, I felt something was amiss and pulled in to find out what it was. Object lesson: when you are working on your car, finish what you are doing before you start another job.

My only real criticism of the whole school is of the Tech Inspection. This procedure should have been especially tough and it was not. Of course, if you count on others to find your mistakes, your life insurance premiums may cease and your wife will miss you all year long instead of just on race weekends.

But to continue with the events. There were about 40 cars in the Drivers School: 4 TDs, 2 SAABs, a gaggle of MGAs, a pack of Giuliettas, assorted TR43s, a Healey, 3 Corvettes, 2 new Elvas, a Ferrari Mondial, 2 Le Mans AC Bristol, and a 190 SL. Strangely enough, no Sprites. They separated the cars into two groups, fast and slow. All practice sessions were run with one group on the track at a time.

The first time out we toured the course under a yellow flag at approximately 50 mph. The observers mixed with the students so that there were about 5 students then an observer, etc. This lasted about ten laps, or thirty minutes.

We rested then while the fast group went out. The next time out we started again on yellow at about 50, and gradually the speed was increased until we were running seventy on the straights. A strict interval was maintained between cars, and the observers would lead various cars through the turns if the students were not taking the correct line.
