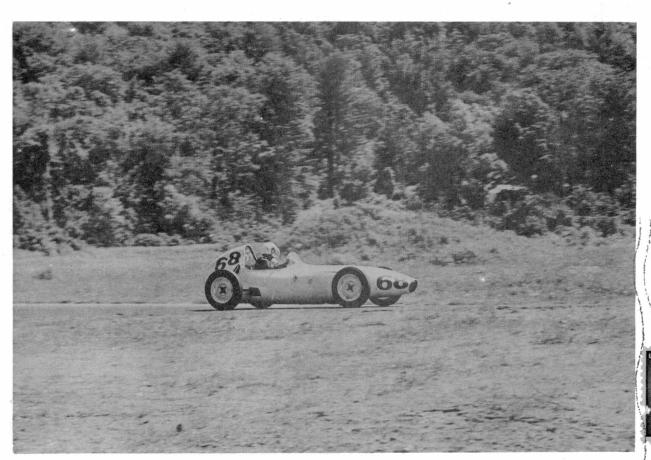

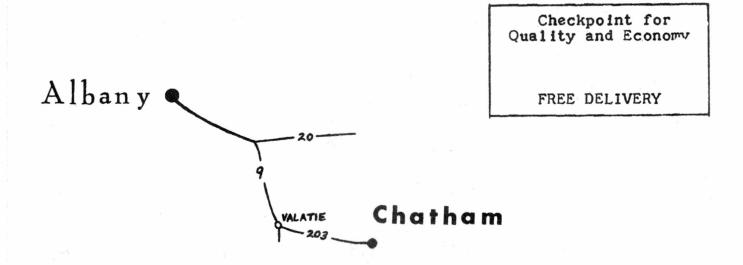

S.C.C.A. ACTIVITIES FOR 1961

Our first activity of the year was the annual January Reliability Run, which started at Nemith's in Latham. Our next attempt at rallying was the 6th Annual Mountain Top Rallye at Lake George. Unfortunately, we started too late but with much enthusiasm. We soon found the 2nd of June approaching much too rapidly and with not enough enthusiasm on the part of the entrants, the Board of Directors decided that discretion was the better part of valor and cancelled the event due to lack of preregistration. I understand Peter Allen, who was rallye master, had a very interesting route worked up for us. Here's hoping he gets the chance to show it to us in the future.

August brought the Edinburg Gymkhana with Phil Lee as Gymkhana Master and Mickey LeVan as his assistant. It was run at the Edinburg Airport and Kart Track. This time it was as dry as our first gymkhana was wet. Except for large clouds of dust and a few marauding air planes, things went very smoothly. Roly Heacox emerged from the dust as overall winner. At the end of the day's activity we found ourselves making a fair amount of money for the first time this year. A very enjoyable evening was had by those who stayed to watch the Kart Races afterward. [Even if Ray did keep losing his chain!]

Back in the Capital District, I was busily trying to find a sponsor for our October 22nd gymkhana, but it seems all the shopping center purse strings were drawn tight. But sponsor or not, the 22nd of October brought a beautiful day with a large and enthusiastic entry. Bob Wallace set up a one-event gymkhana that was hard-fought to the last of the three runs, with Harold Cameron grabbing first overall.

Our last event of the year was Gene Birdsey's Hare & Hound Rallye. Twenty-eight hounds became badly confused when the hare doubled back on his own track and, with the help of a disappearing red pig, lost about everybody for a time.

Also, 8.C.C.A. made money on a Rallye for the first time in quite a while.

Well, this about winds up 1961. I have had a lot of headaches, but I guess it's all worth it in the end. I hope that with the help of our new Constitution and the help of all the members, our next Activities Director has twice as much fun but only half the headaches.

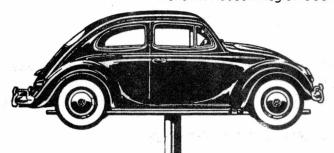
CLAYTON L. BERLINGHOFF

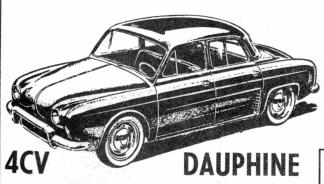
