Report: NEDiv Convention

Although I didn't attend the NEDiv Convention in November I can't tell you how great the partying was but I do have a copy of some of the things that were discussed and I will briefly outline below:

Solo II will run its Nationals in Columbus Ohio next Sept or Oct. The Ladies Class was not dropped. Fully race prepared cars will no longer be illegal in prepared classes.

Timing and Scoring have set up a standard race result sheet for races in the NEDivision.

Tech Seminar discussed roll bar padding. The non resilient padding is better so that the head will not keep bouncing. In 1977 it will be mandatory to change to 1975 helmets pending present changes and materials. Changes are not as extreme as those changes made from the 1968 helmet to the 1970 helmet where the change to the new helmet was to be immediate.

It was decided that there should be a problem line in the tech inspection and a recheck line. This would enable other cars to pass through inspection faster.

The Starters Seminar went over problems of not having a direct line from the Chief Steward to the Starter.

The Flagging Seminar talked of problems between RCA and SCCA.

The Rally people are looking into means of coordinating various rally series into a possible Run-Off Championship similiar to the Sol II Runoffs.

Medical Safety Seminar: Corner ambulance stations is a good idea. At least one RN should be on each ambulance. EMT's should take refresher courses every so often.

The stewards Seminar discussed processing of an appeal, the hearing and denial of an appeal. The flow chart of the Appeals Court was explained. Discussion of the relationship betweentthe stewards and drivers followed.

All SCCA drivers holding a 1975 Regional or National competition license as of December 1, 1975 will receive a complimentary copy of the GCR. Stewards will receive a complimentary GCR following renewal of their 1976 licenses. The chief scrutineer of each Region will receiv a BCR following receipt of the 1976 Regional Officials form in the National Office.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

The SCCA Board of Governors, at its regular mid-November meeting, approved the establishment of an Associate Member category beginning January 1, 1976.

The Associate Membership, available for an annual dues of \$10.00, was established in order to make SCCA more representative to today's auto enthusiast. It is directed at providing membership opportunities and motor sports participation to a greater segment of the motoring population.

SCCA Regions will also benefit as a result of the new program. To align the new Associate Member category with Regional activity, the Board of Governors recognized the autonomy of the Regions and therefore took no position on the question of Regional Associate Membership, an option of the Region. The cost of such membership is also at the option of the Region. Candidates must, however, hold a National Associate Membership before becoming eligible for the regional program.

Upon receipt of an Associate Membership application, the Region in . which the applicant resides will be immediately provided the name and address of the applicant in order that the Region may contact the prospect to invite him/her into Regional membership and to take part in Regional activities. In addition, the Region will receive \$1.00 of the Associate Membership dues. The rebate was approved as an incentive for the Region to actively pursue the new prospect for Regional membership and to cover cost of offering the new Associate Member free admittance to a Regional event as an introduction to SCCA activity.

SCCA members of current or prior year membership are ineligible for the Associate Member category.

The new category member will receive an SCCA Associate Membership card, SCCA identity marks, news bulletins an opportunity to subscribe to SPORTS CAR magazine, and will qualify to participate in the SCCA discount merchandise program. Associate members will be ineligible for race competition licenses, workers license or to participate in racing events. The Associate may, however, hold a worker log book issued by the Region but must be a full SCCA member in order to obtain a worker license. The Associate member is not eligible to earn SCCA Rally Championship points or to participate in any Solo Event championship currently limited to full SCCA members.

Associate members may not hold office at any level nor will they be eligible to vote in National elections. In keeping with the SCCA bylaws, should the Associate wish to hold full membership in a region they must also join National as a full member. The annual \$10.00 A.M. dues may be applied at any time during the membership year to Regular member dues.

Here are a few points? about driving with studded tires which may prove helpful on those roads with intermittent patches of ice and snow. If your car has studs on the rear wheels, and it understeers, it will understeer like it is being towed from behind, but studs may help to correct oversteer. There are several solutions to sudden violent understeer on ice:

1. A stiff shot of booze

2. Flicking on the stereo tape which has "Dead Man's Curve" recorded on it.

3. Punching the gas pedal, which will (a) correct the understeer (or) b) induce understeer, (or) c) slide you sideways off the road, instead of nose-first.

4. Do not, under any circumstances, hit the brakes or your sexuality will be revoked and mayhap not returned.

5. When driving an automobile and going too fast to spin the rear wheels, try flicking it into low, which will break the rear wheels loose, but probably will destroy the internals, though it will save the body.

.....Us to take pride in our Region and the quality of events in which both our organizers and competitors participated.


.....Us to begin to prepare for another year by giving careful consideration to what we want our Region to be and how each of us plans to contribute.
