This rallye also marked the first time in MoHud's recent history that a "special stage" was incorporated into the event. We're looking forward to future MoHud events incorporating similar twists.

I apologize for the mistakes that were present. The lack of Supplements and the mistake on Leg 1, Section I time slip made for enough confusion to be very discouraging to me. We thought we had provided enough recovery points and made the instructions easy enough without taking the navigators' duties away entirely. Unfortunately, however, several people could not recover for one reason or another. For example, many people did not follow Rt. 67 in Stillwater to get to the rallys' last two checkpoints. It was not intended to have everyone learn the hard way but we thought that instruction was obvious enough even that late in the evening.

My heartfelt thanks and appreciation to those who worked. Everyone spent a long night in sub-freezing weather to help put on this event. They gave up the chance to compete and without them the event could not have been run. Special thanks to Bill Hoffert who not only pre-checked the rally, but also worked and brought along a large contingent of workers and competitors alike.

Hopefully, everyone had an enjoyable time in MoHud's first competition event of the year. Certainly, to draw 80+ people out on a cold winter's night to thrash through the woods, or sit on some desolate road says something for the interest that exists in rallying in the Capitol Region.

To continue, we need the support of competitors and workers alike. If we could depend on similar entries at all events, if we could hear about your interests at club meetings, if we can count on some interested parties working new events, then we could have a superb local rally program. But without your support, the local events must give way to the summers' racing program strictly because there is not enough interested personnel to go around.
