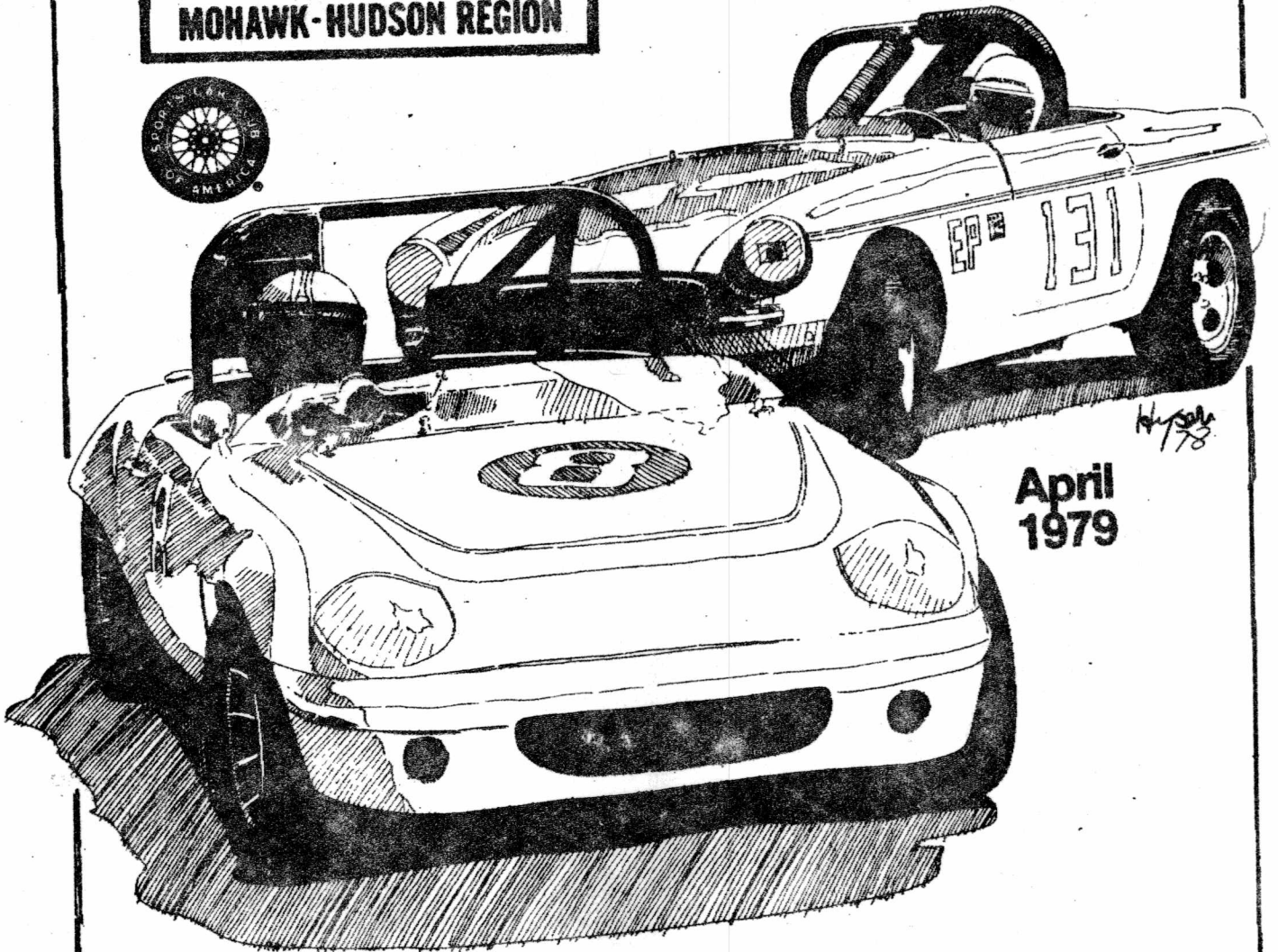
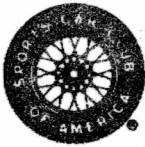

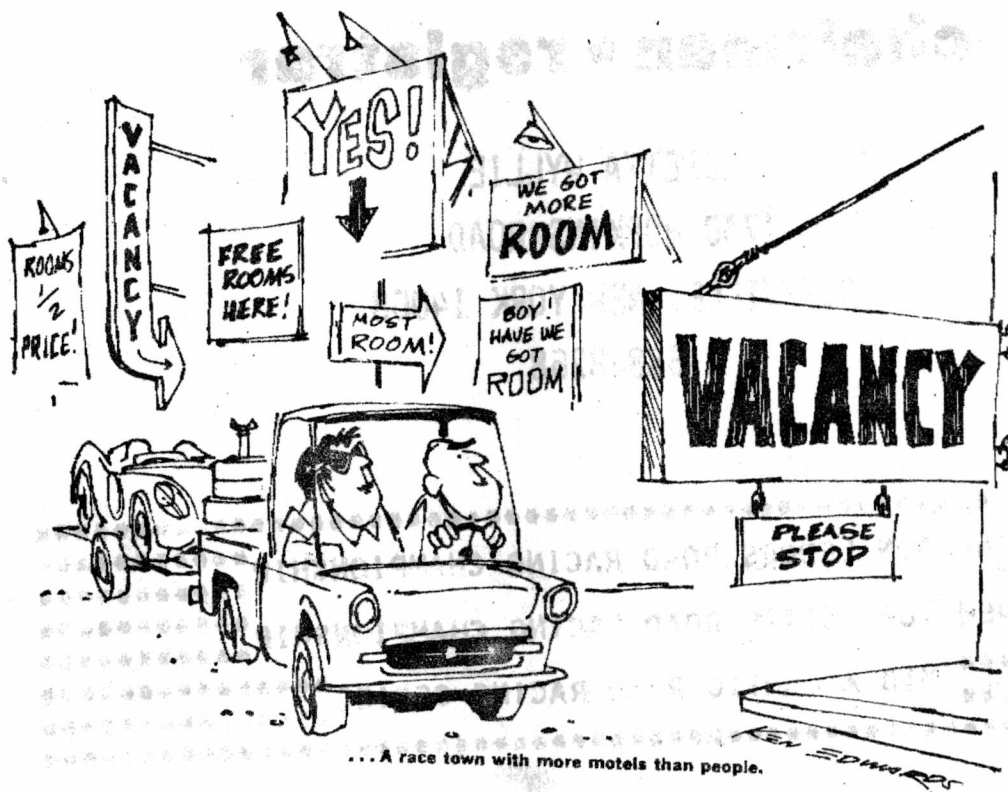
Well, we had an auction after our meeting and it was a success even though the attendance was sparse--we made \$58.00 for the club and had a bunch of fun.

1979 NEDiv Roundtable -Atlantic City, N.J.

Old news you say - Read on. True March 16, 17 and 18 has passed us by, but the "news" that was generated at this meeting won't begin to effect us until the Racing season. Flags for example: Drivers check and read your new GCR - particularly noting a change for a waving yellow Flag. Unfortunately, it is not marked as a change but the wording is different. This year, a waving yellow will require you to slow down. NEDiv's Executive Steward, Tony Phelps of Pa., would like to enforce the tracks in the N.E. to have a Red Flag on every Station. And regarding the Blue Flag, Mr. Phelps will stress it NOT be excessively used. Bravo! And as usual, a waving Blue is a command to give way. So much for Flags.

A note to the Regional Competition Chairman. At the Medical and Safety Seminar, it was pointed out that Diabetics will not be allowed to drive. No exceptions! Since the Comp. Chairman sees this Medical form for Regional drivers, it is his responsibility to keep track of such conditions.

Registration meeting highlights - do not accept phone registrations, they are not legally binding. There is a new registration form recommended for use. And the car number and Class should be put on the back of the entrants check. (Workers, this is a good area to start your day and meet new people.)

The Stewards Session was impressive and important. I sat there with Roly Heacox and Barney Galinsky and listened. Due to the technicalities of this area, I would suggest any questions be directed to Roly or Barney. This meeting had a good attendance of Stewards from the N.E. and interested workers from other Specialties.

Sunday, was the NEDiv Council meeting. Ray Rovinsky presided. A brief outline of the meeting included a discussion on preferred numbers with Martha Dysart, N.E. Pointskeeper. She stressed this is a courtesy service, not mandatory and these numbers are good for only one year. The way this works is - The top 10 National drivers in each class have first choice for numbers from 11/1 to 2/15. From 2/15 to 3/15 any driver can request a preferred number. It should be pointed out, National drivers who compete in a Regional event could run into a circumstance where they would have to give up their number for that race.

Tri-Region discussed their loss of dates this year at Pocono. Seems as though they can't get any kind of a commitment from track authorities. Not to mention the outrageous rental required to have an event at Pocono. A motion was made by Marc Gerstein, NEDiv Officer, that SCCA workers not participate at any 1979 Pocono events unless formally requested by Tri-Region. A vote was taken on a Regional basis and unanimously approved.

We didn't get to cover everything, but we tried. Danced on Friday nite, attended most of the meetings, strolled on the Boardwalk and bought Taffy, checked out the Casino (ask Bonnie about her Black Jack technique) and enjoyed good company from Mo-Hud folks as well as other Regions. Looking forward to visiting our Washington D.C. Region friends November 9-11. They will be hosting the Mini-Convention and celebrating their 25th Birthday.

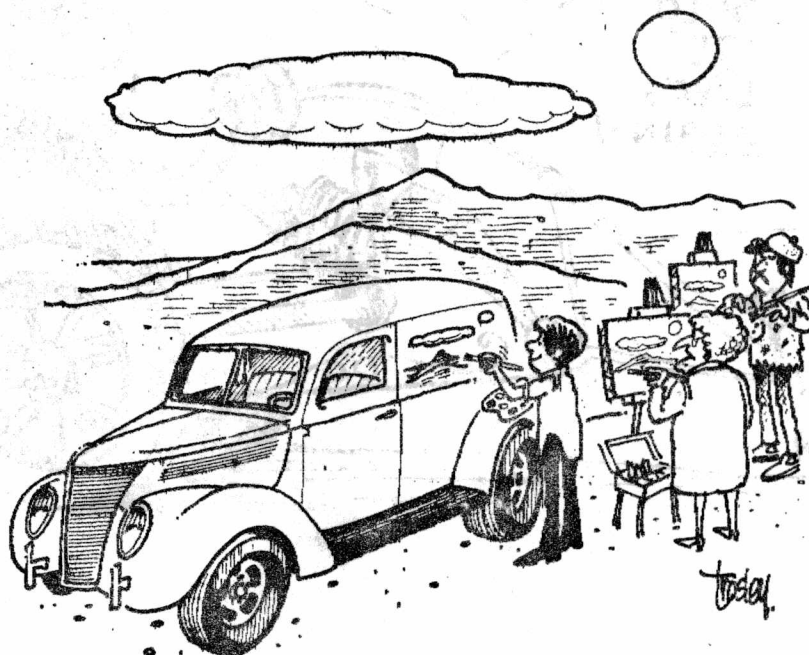
Skip Barber is soliciting other regions for some of the '79 dates since Mo-Hud did not want to be committed to so many dates.

Tom Campbell was presented his 1978 NARRC year end trophy. John Stim was awarded a mementoe of his year in service as R.E..

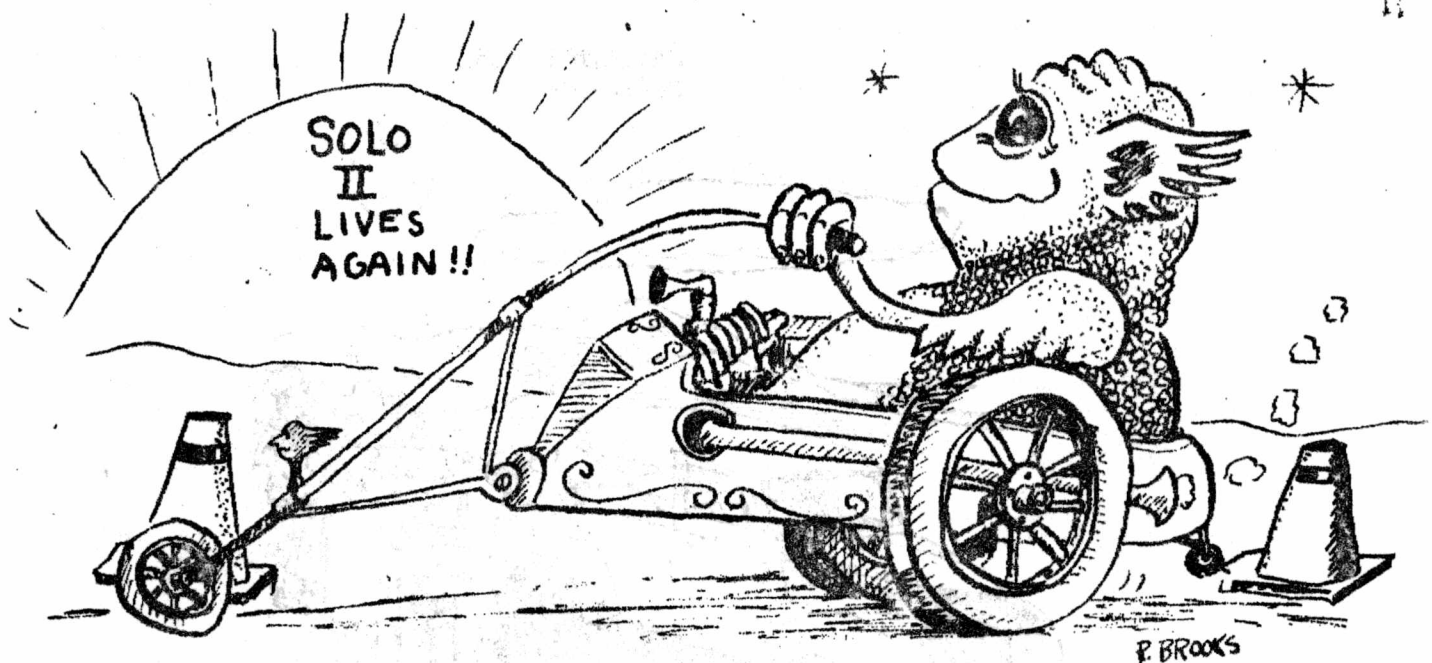
Old Business - John read a letter of appreciation from Lake George for our winter rally.
