
Bill Morris made a motion seconded by Sue Rogers to approve the budget for 1979. Motion approved.


The executive board meeting will be June 25 due to the holiday.

YOUR IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE REQUESTED

TO: All European Code International Standard Halogen headlamp dealers and users

FROM: North American Automotive Lighting Association, Inc. (NAALA)

- 1. It is urgent that you respond in favor of the proposed rulemaking regarding N.Y.S. approval of International Standard Halogen headlamps under N.Y.S. Assembly bill No. 6744, introduced by Assemblyman Peter M. Sullivan and Vincent J. Graber. This bill would legalize European Code headlamps in N.Y.S. as an alternative for the consumer to S.A.E. Sealed Beam headlights. Letters should ordinarily be addressed to the writer's own Senators and Assemblymen. Exceptions to this are the legislators who are members of the Senate or Assembly Transportation Committees.
- 2. The following is a brief description of the qualities we felt should be emphasized in your correspondence with the legislators with respect to ECE headlamps:

With respect to low beam performance, ECE headlamps produce a highly controlled beam pattern which can best be described as a broad "carpet of light on the road." Because of the precision afforded by the lens and the filament shield in the H-4 bulb, this light pattern significantly improves the driver's vision by assisting in lane placement, sign reading and pedestrian identification. All of this is achieved not at the expense of the opposing motorist. ECE lamps have less glare than a seal beam! Furthermore, ECE lamps on low beam produce a uniform light pattern, improving the operator's vision while reducing glare in fog and snow caused by stray vertical light.

ECE headlamps can be aimed easily and efficiently. The consumer need only follow simple directions included with each set of lamps sold to manually aim the headlights with a great degree of precision. In addition, ECE headlamps can be aimed by an optical aiming machine, a method far superior to that which has been generally utilized in aiming seal beams and which has been favored by the NHTSA. Optical aimers are not affected by the shape or size of the headlamp and thereby insure that the beam pattern measured by the machine is the same as that which the driver will see when the lamps are in use. The optical aiming method is used for aiming ECE headlamps but can and is used for seal beams. In fact, many state inspection programs utilize such a machine manufactured by Applied Power Company in Wisconsin.

Headlamps conforming to the international standards are ecologically desirable and durable. When an ECE headlamp burns out, all that must be replaced is a universal Halogen (H-4) bulb. The bulb is small and can easily fit into a glove compartment. Seal beams, on the other hand, must be completely thrown out and cannot be stored conveniently in the auto, due to their size and bulk. Durability is not only increased by using a throw away bulb, but in addition, the ECE headlamps are constructed by bonding an optically efficient crystal lens to a highly polished, tarnish proof metal reflector. This produces a headlamp which is structurally sound and optically superior to the seal beam.

For maximum effectiveness, a letter to your legislator should be;

Individual- neither a form letter signed by the sender but written by another nor
a letter written by the sender but in wording obviously suggested by someone else
or by a group.

- Written on personal or business letterhead (preferably typewritten), with sender's address shown on the letter itself as well as on the envelope.
- Specific as to its subject, identifying the legislation by Assembly or Senate bill number.
- Confined to a single issue, not scattershot.
- Carefully reasoned, clearly stated, and brief.
- Explicit as to the sender's reason for writing, citing personal experience and noting the probable effect of such-and-such legislation on the letter writer himself.
- Natural in its phrasing, not stereotyped, wooden, tendentious, or affected, or showing the influence of having been written at the urging of an organization or group.
