Dave Hathaway announced guests and welcomed on of our older members who has returned to the fold, Bob Brown.


Tom Campbell announced that there will be an open forum for race chiefs. Anyone interested should stay for this after the meeting and auction.

Monday, May 19, 1980

I thought today would never arrive. After twelve weeks of preparation the "Mayday Rallye" is finally history. There were a number of good comments from competitors but there are some perplexing questions to be answered as well. Most serious among these is the question of participation. It's difficult to assess the turnout for "Mayday" due to the rotten weather conditions, which I'm sure had some effect.

A general mailing of 145 pieces was sent prior to the event. Fourteen of the 24 people who entered were on that mailing list, representing a 9.65% response. Since the mailing list has been increased to nearly 250, a 9.65% response would mean 24 entrants. The increase from 14 to 24 as a direct result of mailings would represent a 41.6% improvement in attendance. None of this includes the people who were not contacted by mail, since they knew of the Rallye, and, Series, and had either preregistered or announced their intention to participate.

Interestingly, exactly ½ of the entrants had no club affiliation. The twelve people who entered who did have some club affiliation were divided among three clubs, one of which (BMWCCA) is not a series sponsor. Empire MotorSports Club had the most entrants with 6, MoHud SCCA next with 4 and BMWCCA with two. Berkshire MotorSports Club members did not participate. The logical conclusion is that we, as club members, are not supporting our own club's activities. That's not a good example to set, if we want to attract new members.

Still, in all, I must say that, although I'm disappointed in Sunday's turnout, I'm not discouraged for the prospects of the Series as a whole.

I might add that the quality of competition was not at all disappointing with less than one minute in total penalty points separating the top four finishers and that's for a rallye of nearly $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours duration and 112 official miles in bad weather! Outstanding!

Which brings me to the next point I want to talk about. Isn't it nice how the ideas just flow so easily from one to another? (If you believe that you've never written an article or column before).

For any championship series to have meaning the level of competition must be as high as possible. Stated another way; The prestige of being champions is directly related to the quality of the competition for it. There are those who would tell you that there are no really good rallyists in this area. Don't bet on it - you'd lose! To prove my point, herewith are capsule evaluations of some of the top teams in the area and the Town Crier - Becker Realty Rallye Championship. Class A/B

This class has seen more limited participation than Class C recently and is currently wide open. If you've been itching to try Class A/B this

Owen and Karen Gallagher - the odds - on favorites to repeat as champions if they enter enough events to qualify. The concerns of purchasing their first home may keep them out. With their consistant solid performances, they must be considered a threat for "First Overall" any time they enter.

Cheryl Mochrie and Norm Podrazik (The Unisex Rallye Team). They have beaten themselves as often as others have beaten them, but I suspect that situation will not last much longer. They can always be found in the top six or eight. 20.14 s inserteent blumw

John Stim and Jim Bishop - Overall winners of Snowflake #16. They are so good that they can win any rallye, anywhere, anytime. Enough said!

L. Mark Stone and ? Past overall winner of the prestigious Snowflake (#15) and the 1979 version of the upcoming Rennsco Run II. When he has Mark Goldfarb and the Chronar on his right he is very hard to beat.

Dave Shaw and ? Dave has been rallying with different navigators ever since RSCA's version of Mr. Spock, Dan Genshiemer left for Denver. They were Class A/B Champions in 1978. In one of this year's New England Rallye Champion ship Events (Tri State or Triple Challenge, I can't recall which) he teamed up with Dana Elzenbeck for a Class win. 




