





There is a woodstove and we hope to have a concession for hot food and drinks. Give me a call and let me know YOU are to be counted on.

That's right, it's another two days, two events Ice Trials. Classes for any type of 4 wheeled vehicle with any type of tyres. Front drive, rear drive, whatever moves you. If you're in doubt, call me. Jeeps must have roll bars or hard tops. Dune buggies ditto.
