

#### DRIVER FEATURED ON KNOCK-OFF COVER RESPONDS

Who is Chris Zarzycki and what was he doing on the cover of the Knock Off? While the later can only be answered by the editor; I think I can fill you in on the former.

I started racing in 1976 by going to the then, Skip Barber School of Performance Driving at Thompson Racetrack. In 1977 I ran the first of three seasons in Skip's race series where I met many of MoHud's members who were corner workers.

In 1980 I bought the Formula Vee that was pictured; although it didn't look quite the same then. It was basically an assembled basket case. In 1982 I moved to Connecticut (to work for Skip and get some of my money back!) and I raced the car on and off until 1984. During this time I became a Mohud member.

# NARRC Series Survey results/ page 2

An analysis of the survey results indicate that:

- 1. 58% of the respondents feel there should be no double points races. A further 14% feel that only the runoff should have double points. 26% think there should be double point races other than the runoffs.
- 2. 78% of the respondents feel that points should be the sole criteria for the NARRC championship. 21% think the runoffs are the way to go.
- 3. 55% of the respondents think that all races that participated in should count toward the championship points. 42% feel that a drivers best five finishes should be counted.
- 4. 71% of the respondents feel that the minimum number of races to qualify for the NARRC series should be raised from the current 2. Of these responses, 48% think it should be 1 more than half the races, the other 52% feel it should be raised to 4 races. 24% feel it should be left at 2 races.
- 5. 52% of the respondents think that there is no reason to increase the entry fee to increase the year end payout. 44% are willing to increase the purse through higher entry fees. Some suggested and additional five dollars.
- 6. 69% of the respondents feel that a more substantial trophy is warranted for the NARRC champions, even if it is funded from the points fund money. 29% feel the current trophy is adequate.
- 7. 80% of the respondents feel that 2nd and 3rd place in the NARRC series deserve a trophy even if it is paid for from the points fund. 19% feel that nothing should be done for 2nd and 3rd place.

## NARRC SERIES SURVEY RESULTS RELEASED

Dear John:

Attached are the results of an unsanctioned survey regarding the NARRC series that I have conducted over the last few months. I have sent a copy to each member of the NARRC committee so that you may review it before your next meeting. I took on the task to help quantify the many comments I had heard related to the NARRC series over the last three years. The individual completed surveys have been sent to Joe Deluca and I suggest that they be reviewed. Many have comments, suggestions, complaints and in one case, a previously begun petition. These comments, etc., in some cases are related to NARRC and in other cases regard problems with the regional races in general. In all cases, they help give substance and flavor to the survey numbers. In many cases, they suggest a general frustration, because of the inability to get their points across. Many respondents were thankful for the survey and in some cases, mistakenly thought it was an official survey.

Although it goes beyond the scope of the survey, I feel obliged to pass along the impression that the Showroom Stock drivers are fed up with their lot in life at Lime Rick events. Given the constrain of money, it is inevitable that most regional races at Lime Rock will be one day events. With that given and the strict time problems, it seems that a solution would be to combine practice and qualifying as some regions are now doing and take a few laps off every race. That would allow a slight buffer for unanticipated problems and give everyone a race of reasonable length.

Having just completed the tabulation, I come to the conclusion that there is a gross lack of communication between the drivers and the officials that act in their behalf. I also believe that it is caused by the absence of a formal line of communications between the drivers and the officials. Heads of specialty have the ability to make the views of their group heard by regional and race officials. Drivers have no comparable equivalent and consequently individual comments have no weight. I would like to suggest that, either on a regional or divisional basis, a position equivalent to ombudsman be established. This advocate would serve as a formal conduit between drivers and officials. This person would be in the position, via the regional news letters, to explain the rationale for various decisions made by the officials to the drivers and to communicate the drivers views to the officials at selected meetings.

SOLO SPINS by Jim Garry

Someone recently told me that they felt our Solo II program is trapped in a Catch 22 situation. He said that in order to reach a higher level of event operation we needed more competitors (since workers at Solo II events ARE the competitors). However, in order to get those competitors we needed to run our events at that higher level of operation he mentioned.

My response to this is that it is of little consequence. The crux of the in site availability. As I have written in this column lies previously, without a moderately large parking lot, runway, or closed piece of

road near or within the tri-cities area, our program will not grow.
