Imagine competing in an automotive event utilizing unfamiliar roads in an area that you have never before traveled. Your only sense of direction as you drive from one checkpoint to another is the position of the moon in the sky and your copy of the route instructions. Rallying is a great way to discover America, see countryside, and experience the thrills of automotive sports.

The Harvest Moon Tulip Rally returns this year as an


integral part of the SCCA Touring Rally Series. The event philosophy is simple: provide an interesting and challenging trap—free rally, where both the driver and the navigator can have fun. With this philosophy, the event was chosen Outstanding National Touring Rally of the Year in 1989. 1990 should be no different!

On October 13, 1990, Western Ohio Region SCCA and The National Sports Cars Club of Dayton, Ohio will present the Harvest Moon Tulip Rally as a combined SCCA National Touring Series Rally and an Ohio Rally Championship Event. As part of the two series, the event will draw competitors from Ohio, Indiana, Michigan, Kentucky and nationwide.

Both series are dedicated to the promotion of challenging events where even the first time competitors can compete. One does not need to be a seasoned rallyist to enter. Each series offers three competition classes based upon the equipment used. Each offers a class excellent for the novice rallyist.

For 1990, the course will be about 225 miles long and will traverse several of west-central Ohio's most scenic and rural counties. The roads will be almost entirely paved. The course ranges from twisty and narrow roads to wide open stretches where a competitor can see for miles.

As is traditional for the events of the Ohio Rally Championship series, the event will be run at night. Starting time is 7:01 PM Saturday evening with a mid-rally break and fuel halt at 10:30 PM. Contestants

are back on the road at 11:30 PM with an expected finish at 2:30 AM Sunday morning. Speeds are challenging though maintainable. The object is solely to arrive at the controls on time, neither early or late. No course following or timing traps will be utilized, unless of course you decide to bring your own!

For 1990, the rally starts and ends at the Rodeway Inn at Poe Avenue and I-75

in Dayton, Ohio. The Rodeway Inn is offering a special flat rate of \$38.00 a night for those who register prior to September 25, 1990. To make reservations, call (513) 454-0550. Indicate that you are participating in the rally to get the special rate.

Entry fee is \$45.00 for teams having at least one member of SCCA and \$50.00 for teams without an SCCA member. Trophies will be awarded in the three SCCA classes. These classes are based upon the contestant's equipment levels and include Stock (S), Unequipped (U) and Equipped (E). Many novice and beginning teams find the "S" and "U" classes to be a perfect entry point into the Touring Series.

The route instructions are formatted to provide all necessary information. Each instruction is composed of overall mileage, official interval mileage from the last action point, and a tulip diagram to indicate the shape and the direction of travel when leaving the intersection. Contestants always know the exact location of the next action point, down to the nearest 1/100 of a mile. The only item left up to the imagination of the competitor is the location of the timing controls.

Entry into the Harvest Moon Tulip Rally is open to everyone. Additional information about the event may be obtained by contacting Rallymaster Dan "Coke" Coughnour at (513) 275-5278 (days). The Voodoo Economics of Motorsport

By all accounts the Mohawk-Hudson Region race at Lime Rock Park was a well-orchestrated production. Drivers and officials alike had reason to be proud. Good competition was matched by good organization. The stewards report will show "very good" as the rating in all respects.

Michael Weir spared no effort in bringing together the diverse elements which make for an enjoyable event. His tireless efforts, and those of many other our members, were the crucial ingredient.

It is therefore somewhat disturbing to me, and certainly no reflection on the quality of the event, that with just over 200 cars, our race barely broke even financially.

While a quality event, our race was not fat with frills. Any cuts to the budget would have really had little financial impact, and might have cost a lot in good will.

The two largest expenditures are track rental and insurance, two items over which we have no control.

With an eye already towards 1991, the picture is discouraging. Insurance costs are almost sure to go up, they always do. Track rental may be an unknown, but its hard to imagine it going down. We all know what has happened to fuel prices. And the general economy in the Northeast staggers.

All of that points to even higher entry fees. In turn there may be fewer people who can afford to race, which means lower entry receipts. The viscious circle.

Ways must be found to keep members active and involved in SCCA during the discouraging and lean times. I have seen this cycle before: when competitors get priced out of racing, they become dis-illusioned and leave the sport entirely. This is hardly a desirable state of affairs.

Its true that on very short term our treasury could afford to take a financial loss on a race meeting, but not for very long. And one must question the trade-offs of financial soundness versus staying "a racing region".

The questions are indeed perplexing, and they require innovative responses. Which leads me back to the topic of last month's editorial. Who will lead? Nominating petitions for 1991 officers again appear in this issue: now that you have some insight into the challeneges that lay ahead, I hope you'll contemplate what you can give to the sport.

Many of you will recall when Formula Continental National Champ Bobby Carville was our guest speaker early in the year. He spoke enthusiastically about his 1990 effort in the Canadian Export A FF2000 series. On Sept. 30 the series has its finale, and Carville sits second only three points shy of the top spot. The finale sounds like its going to be classic, and you can hear a first person account of the epic, just days after it happens, when Bobby Carville will be our guest speaker at our October 3 meeting. Hope to see you there.
