NOTES FROM THE MAY BOD MEETING - John Castle

Taking primary attention at the BoD meeting last week was consideration of the 'New Initiative. The Board members had received their 'final' edition of the presentation on Saturday, four days before the meeting started. Obviously this did not leave much time for thorough evaluation.

On Wednesday the Planning Committee met with Nick Craw, Steve Petty and Doug Reed in the morning to iron out some minor problems - and in the PM worked over the wording of the survey questions at the end of the proposals to present a more informed view of the implications behind a vote on some of the items.

The entire Board met the next day. It was felt by the eleven members that the propositions were not yet ready for presentation to the membership. For the present, the action taken by the Board is:

- * There will be no class consolidation (subject to the present 2.5 rule) presented in the proposal.
 - * There will be no change in the present points system.
- * There will be a meeting in June with Carl Haas, the Planning Committee members, Nick Craw, and Steve Petty to put the proposals into a form with which the Board will be more comfortable.

Of course there will be no printed presentation in the July 'Sports Car', but there will be an explanation by the Chairman of the Board of Directors, Carl Haas.

Solo II - The part of the Solo Events Board minutes pertaining to the use of race tracks for solo events has been sent back to the S.E.B. for clarification. This will probably not come up for final vote before December.

Office computer - Although it seems that SCCA must have been among the first to 'blame it on the computer' when things were not as they should have been - there has been cause for such a feeling. Our first computer should never have been bought and the next (and present one) was hardly state of the art when purchased ten years ago and is now getting beyond servicing. Hopefully we shall be able to come up with something this time that will meet our needs in licensing, data extraction and internal use.

Club merchandise - has been discontinued. The sales did not make it profitable for the supplier or SCCA. Either the products or the method of sales was lacking. However, I do feel that we need to make every effort to keep our logo in front of the public, and merchandise with our name on it is an easy way to accomplish just that. If you have any feelings on the matter, let me know.

Pro Racing is taking a different tack. They have worked out an arrangement with Speedway Blues for the sale of 'Official SCCA Pro Racing Merchandise'. This outfit has invested in an on-the-road truck which will be set up at most Trans-Am events. They are also working to create a line of team merchandise.

IN RESPONSE TO A DRIVER SURVEY CONCERNING THE DECISION TO CUT BACK ON THE NUMBER OF NEDIV NATION RACE EVENTS:

As a driver I'm quite pleased with the NEDIV National schedule as it is -

- lots of races to chose from
- enough races relatively close to home so I don't have to travel to Ohio or W.Va. in order to get in 6 or 8 nationals

On the other hand - with so many races the fields can be small; only 3 GT-1 cars started this year at NHIS.

I can also understand how the organizers and, especially, the workers may have too many races to conduct given the cost and resources available.

An important point to keep in mind is how/when the National points structure is going to change. If the championship points are tied to the number of entrants then increasing numbers of serious National competitors will begin avoiding the poorly attended races.


It is not clear to me how fewer races would affect the per-race attendance. Certainly anyone wanting to go to the Runoffs would have to go the the same number of races or perhaps more. I think, however, that only a fraction of the drivers at a National are seriously in the points battle. Many are simply "local" drivers who run both Nationals and Regionals at the tracks that are close to home. These people won't start traveling to the distant nationals but will probably run more Regionals at their home tracks.

Even some of the "full time" National drivers may rethink their programs if faced with increased travel time and expense.

Having witnessed the discussion at the NEDIV convention which led to the decision to cutback on the number of Nationals, I concluded that the "solution" was adopted before the "problem" was fully understood and without a full appreciation of the impact that solution might have.

My opinion is that NEDIV should delay any changes to our race scheduling until the future course of the National racing program is finalized. Then we can seek a rational solution with a full understanding of all the issues.


