Something a bit different this month, as we take a look at motorsports' latest trend: the search for fresh new talent. The idea is that those who harbor dreams of being the next superstar, and who possess the inate talent, but lack the resources, can now get their moment in the spotlight. It began with NASTRAK, which offered the opportunity to drive a Winston CUp stock car at Charlotte Motor Speedway. The top prize of a four race season at Australia's Thunderdome, plus travel expenses, was sufficient enticement to a legion of wanna-be's, including Paul and Karl Hacker and Mustang autocrosser Dave Cook.

The format is generally a testing session, timed laps, and in some cases, an interview to ascertain that elusvie star quality. Some programs exclude drivers who have prior professional experience, and none stipluate any requirement for prior racing credentials.
