NESCCA '93

SCCA'S NORTHEAST DIVISION ANNOUNCES THE "NESCCA SUPERSPORTS NATIONALS" SERIES FOR NEDIV NATIONAL DRIVERS FOR 1993

SCCA NEDIV Convention, NH. Nov 17, 1992---SCCA Track promoters reached an agreement to promote SCCA's top 10 National classes in a new series called "NESCCA"'93.

NESCCA '93....does not add any new race dates or events and will run in conjunction with 8 of the 13 regularly scheduled SCCA races, one at each of the 8 tracks in the Division.

NESCCA awards, recognition and points, will be in addition to regular SCCA National awards and points. Points for both SCCA and NESCCA will be kept by a Series points keeper.

NESCCA points will be based on the number of cars entered in each class. Points awarded will be based on the number of cars a driver beats. Therefore, the more cars that are entered in a class, the higher the number of points that will be awarded in that class.

In addition to naming an overall NESCCA CHAMPION (the highest number of points accumulated by a driver during the season), 10 class championships will be up for grabs in FV, FF, FC, FA, SR, S2000, SSGT, SSC, GT-1, and GT-2. These classes have been identified as the classes that attract the highest number of entries in NEDIV National races. In the future, classes may be added or dropped.

Oscar Koveleski, spokesman for the promoters said, "We are in a period of discovery and discussion, with everyone looking for the "magic formula" that's going to elevate SCCA National racing to new heights. It's not that simple, but at this time the track promoters, want to promote SCCA National racing and and feel that this is a healthy start." A NESCCA '93 poster has been approved; under discussion are TV news clips, Series news releases, and a Series race program.

SCCA National racing needs to provide drivers with more than just a chance to race at the "Runoffs". A top-notch series in the division where they race, featuring the "right" cars and classes will provide them with that opportunity. Also, creating more public awareness about SCCA National racing will mean more value for everyone involved.

The promoters agreed that classes that draw sponsor support, spectator support, and entry support are the ones that deserve NESCCA support. "GT-1, and SSGT may be the most promotable classes we have," remarked one promoter.

NESCCA cars and drivers will display decals and patches supporting the series. While points and the year-end championship awards will be the big prizes for those who race, each NESCCA race event will have it's own "special awards and perks" for the winners. Hopefully, the series will find "title and class" sponsors and contingency sponsors to add to the "pot".

Volunteers are coming in already. Marianne Lyons and Fernando Maldonado will be points keepers, Laurie Sheppard will handle driver photos, biographies, publicity, and help with promotion All national drivers, workers, and potential sponsors interested in supporting NESCCA '93 should send a self-addressed, stamped envelope along with what car class, specialty, or interest you have, and how many miles you are from each of the race tracks where you may participate. and the year that they joined SCCA.

An analysis of membership shows some interesting trends. There seems to be a large drop out rate between two years and five years membership. This is the "pig through the python" phenomenon which I mentioned in my remarks during the January meeting. Members who stick with SCCA for five or more years tend to drop out at a more constant and slower rate. Unfortunately the rate is constant enough that few members remain active after about ten years membership. For example, I am the only member of the Mo Hud class of 1968 still active in the region.

In 1992 there were two peaks in membership one in February with ten new members, and the second in October with nine new members. The March peak is consistent with historical data. These new members are probably people who are interested in working or competing in the upcoming season and deferred joining till the spring. The historical data show the number of new members declining throughout the rest of the year, reaching a low in late fall and winter. The 1992 peak in October probably results from the recruiting effort at the Trans Am race and at the Vintage Fall Festival. This peak represents about six more people joining the region than would otherwise have joined and contributed about half of our net growth this year. Although fifty new members joined Mo Hud this year, thirty seven members did not renew their membership thereby limiting our increase to 13 members for the year.

In conclusion, I would like to thank those who both initiated and supported the recruiting efforts this year. It was a fine efforts in 1992 and look forward to a successful effort in 1993.

Mohawk Hudson Region 1992 Year End Membership Report

This year Mo Hud had recruiting booths at two major events at Lime Rock Park, the Trans Am Race (organized by Mo Hud) and the Vintage Fall Festival. These efforts resulted in approximately six new memberships more than usual for the same period in the past.

The National office has provided me with some membership data for the entire club. This has allowed me to do some statistics which shows how we did in relation to all of the other regions in the club going back to 1990. The results show modest growth in Mo Hud membership as compared to a slight decline in SCCA regional memberships.




