

#### Season's Greetings

'Tis the season... I'd like to wish all of you and your families the very best during the holidays and in the coming new year. From the Region's pespective we had a very successful year, by almost any measure, and I hope next year will bring the same feelings of accomplishment and satisfaction. By the time you read this we will have had our December meeting, election of officiers and, hopefully, a worthwhile discussion about the future direction of the club and our region. I think we have another group of capable, enthusiastic people elected as officiers and Board members to serve during the next year.

#### NARRC

We held a NARRC committee meeting at the recent MiniCon (more on this later) and resolved a few things and set the course for the future. The membership of the committee will be changing for our next meeting in March as neither Fernando Maldonado (NYR) nor Walt Huber (NNJR) are running for re-election in their regions. Henryk Szamota was not in attendance again and Bette French acted as chair for the meeting.

The first item of business was to discuss the "National" competitor exclusion language in the supps for the NARRC finale double points event. The outcome was to elimate any language excluding national drivers qualified for the Runoffs and retain only the points exclusion for first time competitors in the NARRC series at the finale. Because of the timing of the event, closely preceeding Mid-Ohio, it was felt this was necessary as a way of allowing anyone to run the event but not jeopardize a close points battle for a NARRC championship.

Others items included the budgeting of \$1000 for communications expenses, to help disseminate information such as rules, schedules, etc. to the competitors in order to eliminate some of the mystery surrounding the NARRC series operation; the announcement of Art Trier's resignation, as treasurer, at the end of the fiscal year, distribution of season results; discussion of the upcoming banquet (February 5, 1994); and pointskeeping issues with Club Ford. #### Mini-Con Report


Tom Campbell and I attended the event hosted by the Philadelphia Region in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania the week-end before Thanksgiving. A highlight of these meetings is always the scheduling meeting and this time there were big changes made to the status quo. There has been talk, and lots of it, about reducing the number and improving the quality of National racing. Last year the track promotors

in the NEDIV put together the NESCCA series of one race per track with series champs crowned in the top ten classes. This year there were still twelve National races on the preliminary '94 schedule passed out. Before the end of the day this had been pared down to eight, one per track. The four races left off were one at Nelson Ledges, one at Watkins Glen, the July 4th Lime Rock event and reducing the double at Pocono to a single. I think all except the Pocono race will be replaced by a regional of some sort. That part of the issue was not seriously addressed although none will become NARRC events. It was hoped that this reduction in national events with increase the number of entrants and thereby improve the quality of each by giving the promoters something to promote.

I attended a seminar that discussed the exploding growth of "Mini Gran Prix" around the Division and the country. These are events which raise money for charity through the sale of bodied go kart type vehicles (probably not unlike those at the Berkshire Grand Prix) to businesses and groups in order to participate in races through the streets of some community. The SCCA participates by administering and running the events as well as schooling the drivers in some cases. The regions are compensated for their efforts. The most common amount heard mentioned was \$1000 although there was talk of increasing this because of the effort involved. The most common charity involved is the Arthritis Foundation which sees this as a very good fund raiser to the extent that they have registered the name "Mini Gran Prix". There will be up to sixteen of these next year in the NEDIV up from three this past year. The issues and the effort are nearly the same as a regular race with complaints, concerns expressed about rules, insurance, driver's training, safety and tech. The NEDIV council meeting was short this time around with a request to be included on the mailing list of region publications and an inquiry about establishing a Compuserve contact within each region for speeding communications. Do we have anyone so equiped and interested? If so, please let me know and I can put you in touch with the right people.
The Sunday morning session with the Directors was a recap of recent happenings around the SCCA and included the following:
The Mid-Ohio selection for the Runoffs was supported by Alex Miller and Jim Barbour but opposed by Bill Bradshaw. Alex felt that while the bids were financially very close, mid-Ohio

had a better marketing plan for the event. Jim voted for the move because he felt the three regions he represented were for the move. Bill felt there was a lot of pressure to vote for the move, which he resisted, and there wasn't a clear need or reason to move.

#### Notes from the NEDIV Mini-Con November 1993 Tom Campbell

• The Northeast's promotional series for National level racing has completed its first year. At the NEDIV awards banquet on Saturday NIght, Nov. 20th, the class Champions and the top ten overall points earners were appropriately honored. NESCCA's spokesman/organizer Oscar Koveleski presented the awards and discussed the series status.

At a NESCCA committee meeting (I am a member) it was decided to go forward with the same format for 1994, using the same 10 classes. Separately, NEDIV decided that there would only be eight Nationals in 1994, one at each track, so now the NESCCA will be identical to teh full NEDIV schedule. Last year NESCCA only encompassed eight of the twelve NEDIV Nationals.

The Track promotors will again work together to print a supply of series posters. They will be available in February. Continuing effort is being expended to improve series communications, public rationals, and promotability. The biggest concern continues to be lack of cooperation by the drivers.

• There was a meeting of the Competition Board — with the NEDIV member, that is. This was a first and was very well atteneded. Our Rep is Brian Holtz of the DC Region. Brian is a "Good Guy" and we are being well represented. Brian encourages all drivers to write the Comp Board with their concerns and I know from experience that he doesn't mind phone calls to discuss topics in depth. A written letter, however, is distributed to all Comp Board members. Brian also requests that we write in support of planned changes — too often only those opposed to changes bother to write and the Board of Directors can get a biased view of member input.

• As mentioned above NEDIV has finally taken the big step to limit the number of Nationals. The number of drivers is just too small to support the previous 12 race schedule. There will be one National at each of the 8 tracks used by NEDIV regions. Talk is increasing that the same problem is true for regional racing. For 1994 there are over 36 regional race weekends in the NOrtheast, compared to 22 in the Central Division. Some of these races are losing money but no one wants to give up a race date. Some Progress is being made. Steel Cities Region decided to drop one weekend at Nelson Ledges for 1994 and NER has dropped the Memorial Day Regional from the NARRC schedule. I expect the debate to continue.

• Participation in NEDIV National races was down significantly (11%). The average entry per even went from 151 last year to 134, just above the national average. As a division we are third behind CENDIV and NORPAC. Total national entries in the Northeast has declined from 2400 in 1989 to 1580 in 1993.

• GT-5 and CanAm classes are below the 2.5 average entries per event level and are on "probation" next year. They must get their numbers up or risk losing national class status. Comp Bd is planning to move some of the slower GT-4 cars down to help GT-5.

• The new style Camaros/Firebirds and Mustangs are not being approved for SSGT. The concern is for safety. These cars are getting to be too fast. Future of the class is uncertain rumor is that perhaps it will be replaced by American Sedan in 1995.

• Reminder — the NEDIV convention in Nov. and the Roundtable in March are not just for the Regional officers or Divisional level race workers. Everyone in the club is encouraged to attend, whether your interest is racing, rally or Solo. You will meet some fine people, learn about the way the organization is run, participate in seminars on many aspects of the sport and have a good time. If you are reading this you should think about attending one of these meetings soon.

Mohawk Hudson region membership stands at 289 as of 05/14/93.

Here are some statistics which I have gleaned from several sources, including our Mo Hud data base and reports from National. For the January issue, I will try to produce a more comprehensive report, complete with charts and tables.

This year through November, 60 new members have joined the region. During the same period, 28 members have left the region. Several of these are transfers to other regions, but most are people who have not renewed their memberships. This represents a net gain of 32 new members for the region during 1993. At the end of 1992, National reported our paid up membership to be 247. The most recent report from National put our membership at 284. This is a net gain of 37 people. The difference of 5 between the National number and our regional number can be accounted for by transfers in to Mo Hud from other regions, and members holding dual membership in another region as their region of record and dual membership in Mo Hud.

Right now I have 302 people in my active membership data base. I generally keep non paid up members on our rolls longer than National because about half of these members dropped by National are reinstated when they eventually pay their dues. Also Mohawk Hudson's membership rolls haven't been purged in awhile as press of business has interfered somewhat with maintaining the data base, but I am slowly catching up.

National has sent the listing of all of the regions membership history in monthly intervals for the last four years. A casual glance

shows that Mohawk Hudson is continuing to hold it's own among the other regions in membership growth. I will do a more through analysis of these numbers and incorporate the results in the January KO. Meanwhile, the raw numbers for growth (Jan. to Jan.) are: 1990 to 1991, +15; 1991 to 1992, -7; 1992 to 1993, +15; Jan. 1993 to date, +26.

The Paradox database application for membership maintenance is in progress, and I have been using it to maintain the membership lists, print labels, etc. I have recently upgraded to Paradox for Windows. It is significantly better although it is much different than Paradox for DOS, particularly in it's built in programming language. It has sufficiently more power and flexibility, however, so, (deep breath) I am going to change the application from DOS to Windows Paradox. This is a somewhat daunting proposition, since it tool at least several hundred hours of programming time to do the application in the DOS version. But what the heck, it'll be worth it, won't it? A note here for SANTA, please give me membership lists on disks rather than on paper, my life would be soooooo much easier. I'd like to make some brief comments on the fine conversation on membership recruiting and retention we had at the Dec. meeting. The region is doing well at recruiting new members. The biggest gains have grown out of our presence in local auto sport oriented events. These include the Trans Am race at Lime Rock, the performance and racing car shows and our participation with our friends at Saturn of Albany in the yearly rally. If we can expand these efforts to other events we may be able to expand our membership quicker. We need to continue to target our resources on an audience which is already auto sport oriented, it seems to be a winning approach. Something I have been wanting to try is to put an SCCA flyer under the windshield wiper of sports cars encountered in parking lots. If everyone in the club did this, there would be a massive number of people who at least would know that the SCCA exists. Hopefully, some

of these would join up. If anyone around knows if this has been tried, please let me know what the results were.

Tom Campbell had an interesting approach to mentoring new members. This approach entails a current member contacting a new member with similar interests to help the new member get started and feel welcome. This is being tried with some new members and it hopefully will have a good effect on membership retention.

I have always felt that one of the reasons participation in events is so low, is that people just haven't been asked to help. There is nothing so flattering as to have a chief of specialty or a club officer call up and say that they would just be tickled if you would come out to the track and flag a corner. A general call for volunteers is fine, but this additional personal touch can be enough to overcome the reluctance of someone to try something new, particularly when the job looks complicated, like flagging at a race. Perhaps more of this direct approach could be fruitful.

That's it for now, Merry Christmas, Happy Chanukah, and new year.
