

What's been Hap'nan

For one thing, I missed the last issue of the Knock-Off due to inattention to the deadline [not really -see editorial elsewhere in this issue -- rpw]. Rich Welty had allowed us to slack off in meeting the deadlines and, rightly so, he put a stop to it last month. Here it is Memorial Day and I'm doing my duty and producing this column sitting on the back porch soaking up the nice weather. I just finished watching the IMSA race from Lime Rock and saw the Ferraris finish 1-2-3. What really fascinated me was the in car camera work/locations on a couple of the cars. They gave you the best view of the track I've seen. They didn't cover the grassy shot that they might have seen from my car but these guys are pros and only turning 12 seconds a lap faster then my midget, with the chicane! I OD'd on racing this weekend with F1 from Spain, the Indy 500 and the World 600 yesterday and the Busch race the day before. These were all excellent races and for the most part safe as well.

The safety issue is one that has been in the forefront of racing coverage in the last few weeks. Rightly so, this is a concern at all levels of our sport. We go through this analysis and review every year or so when National decides to update some of the grandfathered safety rules to current technology. This approach has seemed to be pragmatic and cost effective for the competitors. The serious injuries that I have seen are usually the result of off track contact of some sort, same as the F1 tragedies, that may have been avoided or lessened by changes to the circuit. The other thing that scares me is the red flag procedure and the way it is interpreted by the drivers. Too many times I have seen far to abrupt slowing of the lead cars when the flag is shown causing a mad scramble in the back of the pack. We might be lowly amateur racers but our opinions should also count when track safety is the issue. Don't hesitate to bring to the attention of the track operator, the SCCA and the event organizer your concerns about track or race operation safety. You might save a fellow competitor from serious harm.

We had our first Solo II of the year at the Peripheral lot on Saturday, May 21. There were about forty cars in attendance and a good course was set by Rich Welty. A new twist was utilized for the first time as Empire Motor Sports Club utilized a sound meter for pre-event screening and on track monitoring to both comply with what they committed to the property owners and to establish base lines for future events. It seems to me that in both Solo and road racing, sound restrictions are in our future. MoHud has purchased its own race caliber sound equipment and it should be used for most of our future events. If for no other reason then to document ambient sound levels vs. race levels.

Our Sixth Annual John Stim Memorial regional race is fast approaching and plans are well underway. I received the registration materials last week and all aspects are well in control. Larry Morton, race chair, and Jack Hanifan, the tutor, have things well in hand. I hope we will have a good sized entry list for our event. Previous event entry levels have been mixed both on the National and Regional levels. We have no opposition on our weekend but there is a holiday weekend immediately following. Let's hope the MoHud reputation pulls in a few entrants. We can still use some help on our chuck wagon gang to help the party master, Rick Pocock, do his thing. Give him a call.

Upcoming Events

We continue to have monthly meetings at the Holiday Inn Turf and also need ideas for program topics. Any ideas you can send my way would be appreciated. On the regional race weekend we will have a "new member" gathering for the purpose of showing you what goes on at a race event. We'll have a picnic lunch as well. 

The Continuing Saga

I regaled you with an account of my trials and tribulations last year with my car and I can't resist continuing some form of update. I decided to enter the Dandelion Gran Prix at Lime Rock on the first of May. Coming off of last years spotty season we had nowhere to go but up. I decided to run the National for a couple of reasons. One was the cost, being a, for me, a local event not requiring an overnight stay it was considerably cheaper than the Mother's Day double regional at Pocono and offered similar amounts of track time. Secondly, I have this vision of being a nationally competitive racer.

My crew chief, Hal Schmidt, and I arrived Friday morning without having done much to the car over the winter. We really hadn't put many miles on the car last year so we felt it was still "fresh". I did modify the intake manifold according to what I saw at the Runoffs last year and installed a high tech Japanese starter motor. The latter was the most pronounced change in recent memory. The car started every time it was asked, except after impound, but who cares then! We qualified fourth out of seven, less than two seconds off the pole, with four of the fastest laps I've ever run at LRP. The race, at first, was typical of production racing, high attrition. On the last lap I encountered the class leader slowing as we approached the checker. I kept the mice churning but came up a foot short to finish second in my second national. I thought I might have won, but a recheck of the scoring proved otherwise. There has been a changing of the guard in F Production this year and my guess for class champ is Harold Flescher for New England Region, who has won once, as of this writing and finished in the top three several times.

I really wish some of you racer types would contribute an article about what it is like to run your events, be it regionals, nationals or Solo events. I'm sure others would enjoy hearing about you trials and tribulations. As evidenced by my ramblings each months, writing ability isn't necessary. Besides, that is why we have an editor. The other benefit would be to reduce the mystery surroundng our sport. It really helps to hear from those who have gone through it what it is really like. All for now Mike Larimer

SCCA - Mohawk-Hudson Region Board Meeting Minutes 5/16/94

Meeting Called to Order @ 7:45 Present: Bob Bownes, Richard Welty, Allison Welty, DJ McArdle, Larry Morton, Stephanie Weiss, Mike Larimer.

ML Distributed an agenda.

1) Gratuity for non-members who help out the region.Discussion among the board members present of an appropriate gratuity ensued. A conclusion was reached - A formal letter of appreciation will be written, framed, and sent.

2) Equipment Purchases:

Radios: Purchase of radios was approved at the last membership meeting.

Timers: Deposit has been made. DJ will overnight the timer order ASAP. The bill was just under \$2,200.

Sound: Larry called the sound folks from NER, and NNJ to discuss the units that they use. Larry has identified a unit and will be investigating further to determine suitability.Empire will buy a temporary unit. Since the identified unit is more than the approved, Larry made a motion to up the budget request for sound equipment to \$1,300. Bob seconded, approved.

3) Point System Review:

A committee to review the current points system has been called for. A discussion of the previous systems points collection covered the issues of how we got where we were. The issue involved is "Is the system still appropriate"? The committee is comprised of Bob Bownes, Rich Welty, Jim Garry, Kurt Weiss, and Bill Hoffert. The giveaway is being worked on.Rick is working on the dinner/party.Mike has mailed out 100 picnic invitations to new members since 1/1/92.Track deposit has been paid.

6) Treasury Status:

We have money. All is well.

7) Other Issues:

There has been a very large problem getting articles, which Richard feels is due to the change from bulk rate to first class. A discussion of the issue followed.
