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This past weekend I attended the NEDiv Roundtable in Reading PA. There were many excellent seminars and some interesting meetings. It was great to get together with members of other regions and discuss what was going on and any upcoming changes. It was very encouraging to hear the progress the New England Region is making on their track acquisition. The track will be called Palmer Motorsports Park, and be situated on a 658acre parcel that NER has signed a purchase contract for. NER has applied for a special use permit and a site plan review. The plan calls for a 2-mile road course as well as a 1,000 X 500 foot paved area for driver training, product demonstrations, & autocrosses. I will keep everyone informed as to any new developments.

Ed Zebrowski, RE of the Glen Region, hosted a seminar on driving the Glen and also told us of changes at the track. The two most interesting changes are the move of race control to an area behind the new grand stands on the front straight,

and subsequently the move of start finish line further down the straight.

There was a tire shaving demonstration held at CJ's Tire and Auto. The shaving demo was on a Toyo R-1 for a Spec Miata, what a surprise. It was interesting & very well done.

In addition to these there were many other areas of interest, that I would encourage anyone interested to consider attending future events.

As far as changes to Lime Rock Park, I think everyone is aware of the addition of safety barriers that will protect the workers and drivers.

The plans for our 50th anniversary party are coming together as well as the Special Edition KO. Stay tuned for updates as we move forward.

As a reminder submissions to the KO should now be e-mailed to Lisa Hanifan and the deadline is the 15th of the month.

I do look forward to any input.

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ON STATION

Well the season is nigh and it's time to begin planning our racing activities for 2006. For those of you who haven't heard, our region is celebrating it's 50th anniversary this year. Happy 50th MoHud! So if you haven't volunteered before for the region, now is the time! Get involved! Our Golden Anniversary is only going to be as good as we make it.

Almost as important are the safety changes that are taking place at our beloved Lime Rock, and I might add long over due changes. Clark Nicholls first brought the changes to light via photos taken in November. I met with Mike Rand, Special Events Co-Ordinator at the track on February 14th for 2 ½ hours to review what has transpired and what the "game plan" is for the track regarding these changes.

Here's what is fact regarding the changes. First, these changes were mandated by IMSA as a continuation for their contract to visit the track. Second, Lime Rock has been very sensative to our (the workers) needs and concerns. In my meeting with Mike we discussed each flag station in detail while visiting each station. I pointed out what I felt (based upon my experience) should be done against what they had changed. We agreed on several changes to the chages for each station. Along the way I made a suggestion for Station 5A (Driver's Left exit of the esses) that no one had thought of regarding workers being able to abondon station. The net result is that our suggestions are being worked into the safety improvements. observations and suggestions overall were right in line with what others who have toured the facility to voiew the changes has already commented on.

Perhaps the single most noticable change, besides 4 rows of armco surrounding almost the entire track, will be the "re-configuration" of the uphill. For almost 50 years the uphill has had no runoff area driver's left, a cause for great concern to many. Well there will now be some 40 feet of paved runoff

area driver's left at the uphill! Trust me when I say that this is not an "alternative" line to get up the hill faster. So if your're thinking good I've now got that nailed...forget it! Another considerable change is Pit In, which is now going to be what IMSA uses. That means False Grid has been relocated into B Paddock. Sorry Jack & Pete you're going to have to find new places to park "Camp MoHud." False Grid has claimed eminent domain on your motorhome spots. And no more mud hole in A Paddock behind the control tower. The enitire area in A Paddock that has 95 feet of continous space longitudally (as we park our rigs) will be paved. So not all of A Paddock will go black.

As someone who can be considered a "track rat" of Lime Rock this is really the third "major" change to the facility in 50 years. The other 2 being mainly cosmetic. And definitely the first real serious major safety change that affects every competitor at the track since the initial installation of double row guard rail back in the late 70's/ early 80's. It is really way over due.

In other news, I've joined the ranks of "car owner/ driver" having just purchased a Caldwell D13 out of Wisconsin. As I sit here writing this article Fred Fox and I are planning to drive out this weekend to retrieve said purchase. Watch out Libbie! Fred's car is being readied for his return to the track after the completion of the "garage mahal" so this ought to be interesting. Crew Chief turned driver and driver turned crew chief. Oh, the humanity of it all....

By the time you read this Rich Alexander and I will either be in Sebring for the 12 hour or on our way back. This ought to be interesting as this year we're driving down instead of our traditional fly down. People are already taking bets on whether or not we wind up in jail someplace south of the Mason/Dixon for some untawdry reason. No one is saying in which direction we're travelling though! Stay tuned this ought to be a classic!

Well, that's all I have for now, stay tuned and I hope to see you "On Station"
