



#### July Report

Short report this month. Many of our drivers were at the NER National at LRP, but the results are not yet posted so I will cover that next month.

Memorial Day weekend, I attended the MVR National at Nelson Ledges. There were not any MoHud drivers competing but there were about 160 entries. I had only been there three times previously but the memories of a run down track, no flush toilets, un-mowed grass, etc. were still fresh. I was pleasantly surprised; the new management has started to turn it into a very nice club facility. Registration is now located across the road from the "Barn". Registration is in a nice two door trailer that allows the registrars to do their work well. The paddock area looks great, freshly mowed grass and paint on the Pit armco really makes a difference.

There are new flush toilets and showers that are cleaned daily. A huge improvement is the repaving of much of the track. The track design is very fast with only one 2<sup>nd</sup> gear turn. The food concession is operated out of a concession trailer but the food is good and inexpensive for track food. The track has built a pavilion next to the food concession that is 3 to 4 times the size of the one at LRP. Track management has leased two large pickup trucks and installed safety equipment on them to provide state of the art emergency services.

I have to congratulate the new owners and the regions that race there on a cooperative effort to create a first class club facility. It is the type of track that we need.

Formerly Vice President and General Manager of Lime Rock Park, Potter has had a long career in the sports marketing and automotive public relations field, and motorsports correspondent for the New York Times.


Potter was the manager of sports marketing for Mercedes-Benz USA from 1995 to 2001 and a provider of consultant services to the New York Auto Show, Ford Motor Division, Mercedes-Benz, Mazda Motors of America and Jaguar Cars of North America. He spent six years as East Coast Public Relations Manager for Mazda Motor of America. He served as senior editor of MotorWeek Illustrated for Turner Broadcasting early in his career.

"Steve has worked in the automobile industry most of his life and is recognized throughout the country" said search committee member Jean Hoffman. "Also impressive is the fact that he is personable and goes out of his way to make people feel welcome. That is a hallmark of this auto museum, so I think he'll fit in perfectly with our professional staff and volunteers."

Along with his professional experience on the business side of motorsports, Potter spent 15 years behind the wheel, winning a pair of Sports Car Club of America divisional championships and competing for a season in the rough and tumble modified division at New Jersey's Wall Stadium.

Potter holds a bachelors degree from Harvard University and did graduate work in clinical psychology at Rutgers University. His wife, Kathy Drake, is a retired editor at Money Magazine and a Skidmore graduate. They are in the process of relocating to the Saratoga area.
