# REPORT

Since the last KO report Mo-Hud has been very busy with both Solo and

In order to have a successful event we needed to have both good weather and 200 entries to break even. The weather reports leading up to race day were not favorable which could explain the poor turnout. After the dust settled we had 118 entries and as you can guess the income fell way short causing a huge loss. It will be a few more weeks until Chip has all the final numbers and we will then have a clearer picture to present to the members. We have been blessed with vendors, members and sister regions who, having realized the large loss Mo-Hud is faced with, have reduced or waived their fees all-together. This leads me to an amazingly kind gesture by David Belden. In a letter to our registrar, David explained he was unable to attend the race due to a family situation. David's letter stated "I gather that Mo-Hud did not have a good entry and will probably lose money on the event. While I can't forgo my entire fee I do want to support the region, one of the better regions to race with. I realize that it isn't much, but I would like to help a little bit." David asked for a small portion of his entry to be refunded with the balance donated to Mo-Hud. The next time you see Dave be sure to thank him for his generous support.

I received a copy of the Glen region's publication Sparkplug, from which I pass on a portion of their RE's report. Ed Zebrowski recounted "A few weeks ago the first Glen Region Solo of the 2007 season was scheduled to take place on Sunday May 6<sup>th</sup> I planed to make a

Bruce Kosakoski posted the fastest time of the day. We were able to get in 5 runs each, not bad considering the weather and a few stray walkers taking a shortcut thru the lot during a charity walk causing us to stop the event for a while. The new display worked flawlessly all day. It took me a while to get it to work when I received it, but once I got the right cable combination to get the laptop, timer and display to work together, it was worth the aggravation. We had one small incident in the paddock. A driver pulled out of his spot and drove over another drivers stuff. Fortunately, the only damage was a Quart of oil, a pair of sunglasses and some oil soaked items. We need to be a little more cautious and considerate of other people's property in the future.

On the day prior to the event we held a car control school. We received a lot of praise for both the school and the event. The instructors were very helpful to the students and are deserving of all the credit for putting on a great school. The majority of the students came back the next day to put what they learned to the test.

The season continued early in June. A test and tune was held on Saturday June 2<sup>nd</sup> also at Adirondack Community College. Over 20 participants drove to their hearts content or till their tires gave out, 15 to 20 runs each was the average. Event #2 was held the following day. The threat of thunderstorms kept attendance in the 60's. All but the last run group had dry conditions. We had to stop the event for about a half hour while a thunder and

lightning storm blew through. The rain stopped, but the course was wet for the last run group. Everyone got 6 runs and then we had a bunch of takers for fun runs at the end of the event. Richie Sorrentino posted the fastest time of the day.

The National tour was held at Devens Airfield in Massachusetts on June 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. We have 4 Champions, CONGRATULATIONS. Alex Shchipkov won DSP, Bruce Kosakoski won FSP, Arnie Bebee won CP and Andy Furlong won EP. Jim Garry got 2<sup>nd</sup> in CM behind his co-driver, Ken Hurd. DJ McArdle finished 10<sup>th</sup> in SM followed by Eric smith in 11<sup>th</sup>. Bert Huiest finished 8<sup>th</sup> in STS and Lyndon Peck finished 4<sup>th</sup> in CSP. Saturday was run in a steady rain and Sunday was dry.

A Show and go on June 23<sup>rd</sup> followed by event #3 at Fulton-Montgomery Community College will have just happened by the time you read this. I will report on that next issue. I met with the folks from FMCC and presented them with a plaque on behalf of the region in appreciation for allowing us to use their site to hold our events. They were very appreciative of the award and thanked us for being respectful of their property.

# **June 2008 Competition Report**

Since my last report, our members have competed at Pocono, LRP, Summit Point and NHIS. The NNJR Mothers Day Double Regional was sparsely attended and only about 20 cars entered the 3hour Enduro. MoHud did well with the team of Dave and Alan Lendrum winning overall in a SM.

The MoHud Double Regional at LRP the following weekend had a dismal turnout of 120 cars. The board had attempted to lure drivers with a "low entry fee" of \$399 for both regionals. The region needed about 202 cars to break even; you can do the math to figure out how we did. Why such a low turn out? With the 53 thousand dollar rental fee for the track plus the cost of insurance, sanction fees, trophies, give always, end of the day parties, and miscellaneous items such as water, printing etc. - We needed the

support of the drivers and did not get it. Weather may have been a factor with the threat of rain all week. (All of the racing except for the very first one on Saturday was in the dry.)

The Race was a critical success with drivers getting almost two hours of track time. 52 minutes of qualifying on Friday and a 12 minute warm-up followed by two 20 lap races on Saturday. More on the race at the July meeting which will be held on the 11<sup>th</sup> of July because the first Wednesday of the month is July 4<sup>th</sup>.

MoHud was represented at the Summit Point 12 hour race by the Karl family who finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in SM. Pete Smith's team was leading SSM when they were punted by a Mercedes. They had to change a shock but managed to finish 6<sup>th</sup>. The event saw one SM hit a turkey and a BMW kill a doe.





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

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# MoHud at the Museum's Auto Show



# **NeDiv Roundtable** by Harry Adalian

For those who have not been to a SCCA NeDiv Roundtable or Mini-Con, they are meetings held once a year for the Northeast Division (NeDiv) of SCCA. The Mini-Con is held in the fall and the Roundtable is held each spring. This gathering of people from the division enable us to meet and exchange ideas, work out schedules and provide all other "behind the scenes" operations to put on SCCA Motorsports in our division. You have probably already heard about all the musings and schedules so I will just take a minute and give you my belated impressions.

As always I had a great time. I traveled with Tom Campbell and Gene Tricozzi; we were met by Mo-Huders Roly Heacox, Jack Hanifan and the honorable John Sheridan who had come in from Florida.

The roundtable schedule had the usual conflicts built into it but Gene and I were able to split up to get the most information we could to bring back.

New on tap this year for the online registration were a bunch of enhancements to help the registrar, so we will not have to learn too much this year. If you used online registration in '06 make sure you update the personal information, car information, or any medical that may have changed.

I went in to the tech meeting with our Divisional Administrator of scrutineering, Bill Etherington. It was a small group of people but we discussed many things on a one-to-one basis. Two things came out of this meeting that I feel were significant. One is the use of non resilient padding in the cage area for head protection. A lot of people in the past have had a resilient padding in this area, this year it will need to be updated. The GCR states: "Forward braces and portions of the main hoop subject to contact by the driver's helmet (as seated normally and restrained by seatbelt/shoulder harness) shall be padded with non-resilient material such as Ethafoam® or Ensolite® with a minimum thickness of one-half (1/2) inch. Padding meeting SFI spec 45.1 or FIA 8857-2001 is strongly recommended." I would recommend getting the SFI 45.1 padding

Second thing of interest is your friendly tech people will be looking at your shoulder belt installation. With the onset of the HANS and greater attention given to driver restraints, it has become more important that shoulder belts in the vehicle are as described by the GCR. We've been instructed to give this special attention this year so please take the time to see your belts are installed in a compliant manner. In addition to the angle of the belt from the shoulder to the roll cage, there should

be some consideration to have the anchor points of these belts not be spaced more that 6 inches apart from the center of the belts. While I am on this subject I would like to see all of my friends get a right side safety net. This is an inexpensive, very critical (IMHO) piece of safety equipment being recommended this year. I don't know why it was not made mandatory since they added the requirement for the second bar in SS and other classes this year but it wasn't. Hell, while I'm on my high horse you should have a Hans by now too.

To my surprise, there is still a fuel test port problem. By now I hope everyone has had them in, if you don't or have a problem figuring how to get it done feel free to contact Richard Welty (chief of tech) or myself for some ideas. Enough of tech!

Jeff Dahnert, the VP of Finance from SCCA, spoke at the directors meeting. He mentioned they are working on better disclosure and we should see something soon. He also mentioned he gave a Powerpoint presentation at the national convention and SCCA's cash flow is on a par with other organizations of this budget level.

I love this organization, the people in it and their dedication to the sport. After my short tenure of 11 years, to this day, it still astounds me how much everyone gives and how little they ask. I am however becoming increasing cynical about the institution that is SCCA (national). I mean no disrespect to the many people that have put in decades of work and dedication. It is their work that has made this organization what it is. The problem I have is with national looking for more money. This is the most expensive motorsport organization I belong to including motorcycles. Seems to me when this club was formed some 60 years ago a lot has changed. It takes SCCA too long to spot a trend and even longer to do anything about it. I realize this is also a strength in some cases but after listening to Jeff speak about threats to the organization and how people are leaving for other venues and organizations and the need to find more revenue kind of hit a nerve with me. I don't believe getting more capital is the answer to the club's problems. I would like to see the national staff reduce their expenses and bring the club's membership and benefits in line with other organizations that perform similar services.

God bless the Workers, Specialty Chiefs and Stewards, to me, they are SCCA and could operate under any banner with the grace and integrity they display.
