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

MoHud and Racing lose a Champion Driver



PAUL HACKER

Well, the KO is late this month. It would have been out several days ago but the editor has been waiting for my article. I have had writers block because I knew I had to write about Paul Hacker. Paul started out as the MoHud Rookie of the year in his Showroom Stock Dodge Colt. This was back when Showroom Stock Cars were **STOCK**. There were no cages, only a roll bar. Cars did not have window nets, they had to use stock wheels, you could not change exhausts or add "trunk packages", and you could not even paint graphics on them.

Paul went to Driver's School at Pocono and when he was over a second under the track record, he was signed off. Needless to say this was the beginning of an unequaled career. Paul would go on to win the Car and Driver Challenge and 52 professional races. He holds the record for the number of IMSA championships won. He began as an autocrosser and ice racer and never forgot his beginnings, returning recently to win an AMEC Ice Racing Championship.

I can think of many stories but the one that probably reminds me the most of what Paul was like happened about 35 years ago at an Ice Race at Cossayuna Lake. It was the last lap, going into the last turn and I was in the lead with Paul right on my tail. There was no way he could pass me on the outside; all I had to do to win was go through that last turn without making a mistake. As I approached the braking point, I looked in my Wink and all I saw was Paul behind me – both hands off the wheel, hands held up next to his helmet and sticking his tongue out at me. In the second that I looked at him he got inside me and beat me to the finish for the win. I had such a laugh I did not even care about the win. In the last several days it has been said that Paul did it his way. This is certainly true and is one of the many things we will remember about him.

RESULTS

It is important to check the provisional results after your race. T & S does make mistakes; most of these errors are due to poor information from the transponder. If you've ever loaned your transponder to someone, or are using a borrowed transponder, the information on class and name may not get properly entered into the Timing and Scoring database. When you check the provisional results (you have 30 minutes) don't just check times. Check your class and other info; once they become final it is difficult to change. Points keepers and the National office use the results for year end awards and licensing.

PAUL HACKER 1947-2009

A Champion's Passing

Paul Hacker, prolific in his success in the world of showroom stock racing, died in the early part of this weekend of August 29th, the victim of rapidly spreading cancer. Our paths crossed often, and I was witness to some of his notable racetrack accomplishments. We both got our start via the local gymkhana scene around the same time, in the late 1960s, and we even were in cars that were similar, though far from the same. Paul's was a blue Chevelle Supersport 396; mine had the same nameplate but was a six-cylinder, four-door, automatic. That portended how our paths would diverge.

Paul was determined in a manner rarely replicated among the local sports car contingent. Where for most it was a hobby, albeit a passionate pursuit, Paul expected much more. From autocross and ice racing he moved to the SCCA's showroom stock class, and achieved instantaneous success. Starting in a Dodge Colt he switched allegiance to Volkswagen when professional races were established for the newly-introduced Scirocco. He'd take that same make to victory in the 1975 Car & Driver Showroom Stock Challenge.

When VW hit upon the idea for a national touring series featuring the Rabbit (and later Golf) it seemed made to order for continuing the Hacker family racing tradition. Paul's father Lou had been a fixture on the local oval tracks when the phrase "stock car" was an essential truth. Paul's ideal was that racing should carry its own weight financially, the true essence of the term "professional".

As the racing world evolved from the 70s to the 80s and into the 90s Paul, teamed with his brother Karl, was always a force to be reckoned with, whether it was short sprint races or the challenging discipline of endurance racing. The Hacker Express achieved prominent success for Volkswagen, and later Oldsmobile, and finally Ford. But in spite of this proven track record Paul found very few opportunities to ply his skill in other arenas. As this segment of sport evolved away from self-sustaining to pay-to-play Paul seemed to get increasingly frustrated that marketing could trump merit.

With a feeling of almost forced exile Paul's role in the sport diminished. He had a few tries at team management, and harbored a hope that when Volkswagen re-entered the US motorsport scene with its TDI Cup there might be a place for him, but the current operatives were clueless about his pivotal role in a prior generation. In a sense he found his way back to his roots, achieving success in AMEC's ice racing series, and was keyed to take a larger role when cruel fate intervened.
