
Tales From the Track—The Circle is Unbroken by Greg Rickes

Tales From the Track – Race Recap

LRP Paddock Crawl June 14-15 - By Chip VanSlyke

I love this event. It is, as Clark Nicholls once told me, a homecoming. I see people I sometimes see only once a year and more of our region's people than anywhere else. Lots of MoHud representation both on the track as well as marshalling. We also get lots of visitors and old friends who are great to see.

With over 200 entries, registration was bound to be slow. Quite a few people had arrived by 4 o'clock versus the advertised 6 o'clock opening. Perhaps hoping to get in early (like I was). In past years the track has let people in early as long as they stayed in B-paddock which is fine with me. But on that Thursday I guess the SCDA event was highly subscribed. Fortunately, the track agreed to let us in at 5 and NER opened registration early.

Friday was hot and humid and it was threatening to rain all day. Which it did deliver in the afternoon. Everyone got a more or less dry morning. Our group, group 2, saw a little spatter in the morning but it wasn't enough to slow the track down. Personally, it was a great session for me, taking fastest lap of all the FFs and CFs. A time that would stand as fast lap of the weekend for both classes. Also, the best lap I have done at LRP with no draft assistance.

That put me on "pole" for the afternoon qualifying sprint. Of course, being the slowest class in the group, that really meant starting 10th. The qualifying sprint is really just another qualifying session with the fastest lap of either Friday session establishing the grid for Saturday morning. After about 10 laps in the afternoon it was clear that the track had slowed so I came in early. At the end of that session the rain started and the next few sessions were full wet. The rain did slow and I think at least the last two groups ran in the dry.

The Paddock Crawl was a great success. I always enjoy being able to talk with other drivers, course marshals, track announcers, etc. whom I often would not get a chance to talk to. Trish and Jim Bucci came up from Florida not just to visit but to man the Margarita stand which included ice cream this year.

Saturday morning brought clear skies and cooler temperatures. Absolutely perfect racing conditions. As far as my race, there was some trepidation. My main competition, Steve Roux, had an electrical gremlin in the morning, keeping him from his best lap and keeping him behind me in the am race. I knew this would not last. It didn't. By the end of the first lap he was

cruising by me on the front straight. In general, we run close at LRP, but his car has better straight-line speed. I was able to stay with him for a couple more laps and then took him on a late brake into turn one. He followed for a lap or two more but I saw him go off in West Bend in my mirrors. That would be the last I saw of him in that race giving me the victory. Turns out there was an issue with his rear suspension causing him to retire. He and his car were unharmed save for a lot of dirt picked up off track.



For the afternoon, my trepidation would continue. I checked in with Steve and his issue was easily repaired and I knew with his car running well it would be difficult to stay in front. The afternoon race turned out to be the best of the weekend (results notwithstanding). Because he DNF'ed and pm grid was based on am finishing position, Steve would be 5 positions behind me at the start. I got a good start but Steve easily dispensed with the cars in between us and he was in my mirrors by turn one. I still had a decent gap and was benefitting from a draft from a P2 and FC that were in front of me, but that blessing would turn into a curse as the P2 spun and touched the FC causing both to spin in front of me going into turn one. I was able to stay on the pavement but had to slow massively.





Steve was able to take advantage and took the position but I was still in his draft. The incident brought out a full course caution. After the restart, I more or less stayed even with Steve then benefitted slightly from lap traffic and got him into turn 1 to resume the lead. That didn't last long with Steve cruising by on the front straight on the following lap.



Not much would change after that. I tried to stay with Steve for the next few laps but he was able to inch away slowly until I was out of the draft. With a massive gap to the next FF/CF, I switched into "bring it home in one piece" mode for the remainder of the race.

Big takeaway regarding car development is how I could get Steve under threshold braking into turn one but he clearly has a straight-line speed advantage. This is likely due to aero, Steve's car being of more modern design with a small cross section.

Highlights include one win and a second as well as my Friday morning qualifying lap standing as fastest lap for all of FF/CF for the weekend.

NER put on a great event as usual with no major hiccups that I could see. A fair number of cautions but all were managed well with minimum FCC and lots of green flag action.


